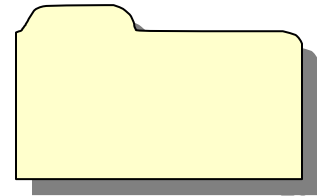


Project #2 - Option B

BOOK FOLDER

Summer Reading Project



A book folder is another way you can share what you have read with others. This will help you organize ideas found within the book in a way that others can view and use.

To do this project, you must use a basic file folder like shown in the pictures above OR a typical paper folder. Then, you have to cover each side with the required information, including one piece of paper that will go inside.

Requirements:

- On the front cover, you should create a new cover for the book. What design would you have put on the front to draw in readers? This can be hand-drawn or computer created and should cover a majority of the folder. This should be original and not a copy of an actual book cover, and it **SHOULD NOT** include any pictures taken from a movie/television show version of the book.
- One piece of paper inside the folder must briefly describe why you made the choices you did on your front cover. This should be approximately 5-7 sentences long, and it must include at least two pieces of text, which means exact wording from your book that have been placed in quotes, to support what you have described. Please remember to include page numbers of the two exact phrases you use. In addition, if you use pictures from a source that is not yourself, you must cite those pictures using proper MLA citation at the bottom of this page.
- The inside left must include brief information about the author. This should be done in 5-6 sentences and **IN YOUR OWN WORDS**. Be sure to include the source of the information (Don't use Wikipedia!) using correct MLA citations.
- On the right side of the folder, you must create a review of the book. Be sure it is at least 7 sentences long. It should tell whether you like or dislike the book and why. Be sure to refer to at least two phrases of text, which are exact words from the book placed in quotations with page numbers, to support what you are saying. We should see your personality shine through as you write your review.
- Finally, the back cover must have a brief summary of the book, like you would find on the back of a book. It must be original and tease the reader into the book. Don't give away the ending! This should be similar to your book critique with the exception of the review information that is already on the inside flap.
- Your folder must be aesthetically pleasing! This means that all information should be:
 - Typed
 - Pasted neatly into the appropriate place on the folder
 - Use creative and easy-to-read font choices
 - Use a variety of pictures to make it fun to look at. A minimum of three pictures in addition to the front cover are required. Examples might be pictures of author or scenes from book to help illustrate your writing.
- When you turn in your project, your **BOOK TITLE** and **YOUR NAME** should be on the tab. In addition, your rubric with your name on it should be placed inside the cover.

The Rubric: Book Folder

	Points	Comments
Aesthetic Appeal Folder is neatly put together. This includes being laid out clearly, using creative fonts, containing at least three pictures, and being glued in neatly and in the proper place on the folder.	/5	
Front Cover Design with Explanation Front cover picture/s display are creative and neatly done by hand or computer. Cover makes others want to read book. If copyrighted pictures are used, they are cited. The explanation of the choices made on the front cover shows a direct connection to the book. The paragraph is clearly written and uses a minimum of two pieces of wording (with page numbers) from the book to support.	/5	
Author Information The author information gives a clear overview of the author's life. This information given is written in the student's own words. The information is then cited (MLA for sophomores, website given for freshmen).	/5	
Review The book review discusses the reader's like/dislike of the book as well as who might be interested in reading it. The writing is original.	/5	
Summary The back cover has a clear summary of the book that teases others into reading the book. This is done in a creative and unique way!	/5
