

# Project #2 - Option C

## Word/Picture Collage

### Summer Reading Project

To complete this project, you will use words or pictures or a combination of both to create a collage that highlights major themes and ideas in the book you read. After you have created your collage, you must then include an explanation list (key) that discusses why you chose that word/picture as an important part of the novel. You must refer to text (exact words taken from book!) when making these choices! Include a quote and page number to do this!

#### Requirements:

- You must include the title of the novel and the author's name on your collage.
- You must include at least 20 words or pictures, but you may include more.
  - Ideas of images you might include could be a picture of a main character, the setting, or something important to a main character. Words might be an important quote, central words for issues in the book, a statement of themes, or important vocabulary.
  - Any picture or word that you choose should be representative of significant parts of the text.
  - You may NOT use pictures from a movie version of the book!
- You must include a key (not an actual key—an explanation of your choices) on the back of the collage that explains why the choices were made for each word or image. A key is included to use.
  - You must have linked them to textual evidence from the book. That means for each word or picture, you should have one concrete detail (aka quote) from the book with a page number and an explanation for why you chose that word/picture and quote to represent the novel.
  - That means that you should have at least 20 quotes and 20 explanations as well.
- You may use words cut out or hand written, photographs you have taken, hand-drawn images, or images from another source to create this project. Some students have found it fun to try to find things in their lives they can take photos of to represent the book, which is especially fun if you like photography. You may also use the program Wordle ([www.wordle.net](http://www.wordle.net)) IF you add additional detail.
  - The overall aesthetic appeal, including execution and precision, will be part of the final project grade. Make sure you use your resources wisely.
